Please Note:

- A Notice of Intended Prosecution must be received by the registered keeper of the vehicle within 14 days of the offence.
- 'Other' reasons offences were not proceeded with include:
 - **Date of birth not found** – this occurs with drivers whose licenses are registered abroad. Their date of birth will not be on the DVLA record.
 - **Negative response from DVLA**
 - **The registered keeper / driver is deceased**
 - **Registered keeper / driver in prison**
 - **Liquidation** – when the vehicle is registered to a company which has subsequently stopped trading
 - **Excused** – normally, the applicant would have to elect to attend court to explain any mitigation, but in clear-cut cases about which they can provide proof, the case can be cancelled
 - **Statutory time limit to prosecute expired**
 - **Emergency vehicle on 999 or Blue Light call**
